- Voorbeelden: Energieakkoord voor duurzame groei, Internationaal MVO

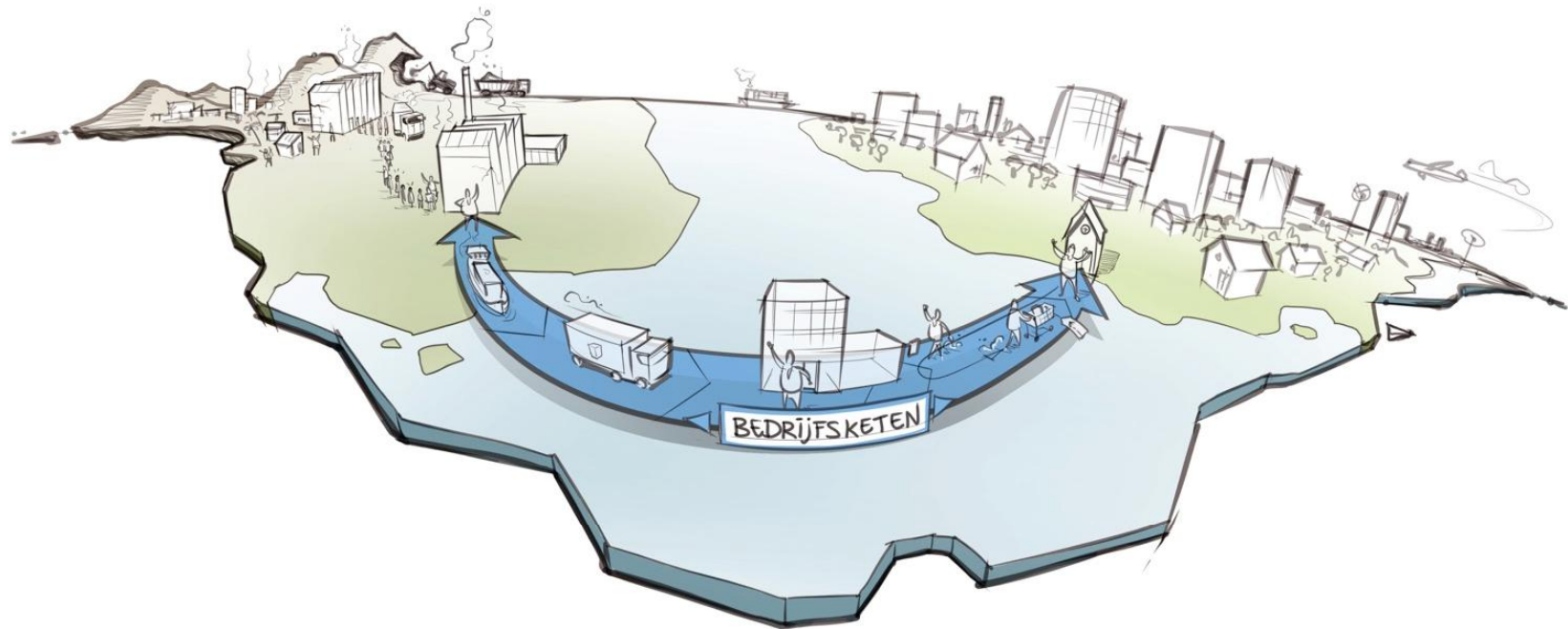

Banking agreement

- **Main framework:** OECD Guidelines for Multinationals
UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights
- **Thematic focus:** Human rights
- **Product focus:** Corporate lending
Project finance

*Asset management** if institutional investors do not cover this*

*) In addition: alignment with relevant standards such as the IFC Performance Standards, Equator Principles, Voluntary Guidelines on the Responsible Governance of Tenure of Land, Fisheries and Forests.

***) Limited to management of in-house investment funds and assets under management of clients as part of discretionary mandates.

Banking agreement

Deliverables:

- Exchange of information on human rights risks
- Best practices to increase leverage
- Value chain analyses risk sectors: palm oil, gold and cacao (and more)
- More clarity on the responsibility of banks (linked to/contribute/cause)
- NVB Sectoral Advisory Mechanism
- Several reports expected this year: value chain analysis, monitoring report, etc.

Why?

Mining and processing of gold: heightened risk of violations of human rights, labour rights and environmental safeguards:

- Impact on natural environment
- Deforestation
- Mine waste
- Water management
- Chemicals (mercury)
- Working conditions
- Child labour
- Impact on local communities
- Smuggling. Corruption
- Conflict resources
- Recycling

Dutch gold sector

Consumption:

- **One kilo of gold** can be recovered from **50,000 mobile telephones**.
- Dutch people have an average of **four to six old mobile phones** lying unused in a drawer.
- Each person produces **23,4 kilo of e-waste**. Often this includes a small quantity of gold.
- The Dutch recycle **less than a third** of their e-waste.
- According to Statistics Netherlands, the country throws away **27 million euros** a year this way.
- Dutch jewelry stores use mostly recycled gold.

Gold IRBC Agreement

Greater respect for human rights, the environment and biodiversity throughout the chain, from mining to recycling:

- OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.
- Concrete positive impact in and around gold mines and in collecting and recycling waste from electrical & electronic equipment, through joint efforts.
- Increase the collective leverage of the Agreement.

→ Increase supply and demand of sustainable gold

- UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights

- Politieke steun (kabinet/minister & TK) – MinBuza breed/rijksoverheid breed – voortgangsrapportage, RA: 2 jr
- Korte termijn successen en lange termijn impact
- Internationaal uniek instrument – leerproces – heeft tijd nodig om potentieel waar te maken
- Van totstandkoming naar implementatie – eigenaarschap en vertrouwen
