



- 130 million Euro investment capital










Production over the years










Production challenges differ per region

Examples of SCP pre-competitive collaboration

- The establishment of the Vietnam Coffee
 Coordination Board and a National Sustainability
 Curriculum endorsed by the public and private
 sectors
- Working with the Ethiopian Commodity Exchange (ECX) to develop a Traceability system for coffee
- Guidelines to access earmarked funds for Brazilian coffee growers
